Zip Code: I-R-E-A-D at Frank P. Long Intermediate School, sponsored by Frances Cornacchiulo, Julia Salembier & JoAnn Tomaszewski. This project is to alleviate the regression that often occurs in academic skill over the summer.

<u>The Literacy Backpack Program</u> at Brookhaven Elementary School, sponsored by Stephanie Miller, Victoria Suarez & Mary Pettit. This project will provide collections of books to students grade level K-3 with parents involved.
