Mary Pettit, a teacher at Frank P. Long Intermediate School, requested \$1,859.30 in the 2016 grant cycle to fund a project titled "Book Talk Center."

Ms. Pettit observed that good readers as well as struggling readers enjoy listening to advanced material. Listening to books encourages conversations about books and the entire class benefits.

The grant paid for the center consisting of dozens of titles, wireless headsets and a console for the equipment. The program was quickly off and running.

The students were encouraged to pen notes of thanks to

SCEF and the contents of the notes revealed how a small amount of money can transform a classroom and young minds.

One student noted that the books "smell good." Another who admitted he "honestly used to hate reading" experienced a remarkable transformation and began to enjoy it. For one young reader, his thank you was summed up in a simple declaration: "I'm in book heaven!"

## YOGA IN ELEMENTARY P.E.

## MAKING READING FUN

### BELLPORT MIDDLE SCHOOL

The materials from NASCO have been used daily in Ms. Hartill's, Mrs. Albrecht's and Mrs. Donovan's classrooms. In Mrs. Albrecht's and Mrs. Donovan's classrooms these materials have helped students to maintain focus. The ball chairs and foot fidgets have provided increased attention to task for the students they are being used with. In Ms. Hartill's class, the materials have been used to assess students on their speech goals while covering content appropriate material. The book sets from High Noon Books have provided wonderful reading programs for students who have a weakness in the area of reading. These books have helped to increase students' sight word vocabulary and decoding/encoding skills. We have observed a significant increase in comprehension skills as a direct result of the improved reading skills gained through these materials.

## **\$26,600 FUNDS 18 GRANTS IN THE 2016 / 2017 SCEF FALL GRANT CYCLE...**

Every school participated in the SCEF 2016/2017 Fall Grant Cycle. With the grants awarded, BHS students will be able to perform college-level laboratory research at SUNY Stonybrook, create large scale murals to decorate the BHS, and participate in several art workshops. Bellport Middle School students will be able to use technology to advance their math skills with interactive student notebooks. Frank P. Long students will participate in a Woodworkers Club, visit the Suffolk County Farm, utilize their STEM skills through small group activities, and further their math knowledge through literacy. The Elementary school students will have opportunities to participate in a Yoga program, learn about Oceanography, and participate in art workshops. All these efforts could only have come to fruition with the great support of the community.
